| DBSPD Detective Wilmot observed the vehicle unoccupied at 1155 hours as units set up in the area and |
| waited for to possibly exit the shopping plaza. Several minutes later Detective Wilmot advised she |
| observed exit the Winn Dixie and walk towards the Cadillac, which is registered to |
| attempted to enter the driver side door of the Cadillac as he was contacted and taken into custody by |

| TFO Howard was made aware upon contact with step father , he was unsure about |
| giving consent and denied law enforcement the consent to search the residence. DBPD and DBSPD |

| (1) Any person who writes or composes and also sends or procures the sending of any letter, inscribed |
| communication, or electronic communication, whether such letter or communication be signed or |
| anonymous, to any person, containing a threat to kill or to do bodily injury to the person to whom such |
| letter or communication is sent, or a threat to kill or do bodily injury to any member of the family of the |
| person to whom such letter or communication is sent, or any person who makes, posts, or transmits a |
| threat in a writing or other record, including an electronic record, to conduct a mass shooting or an act of |
| terrorism, in any manner that would allow another person to view the threat, commits a felony of the |
| second degree, punishable as provided. |

| Further TFO Howard served a search warrant at known residence located at , Daytona |
| Beach, as he stated during his interview the cell phone he used to make the written threats is located inside |
| his bedroom in the residence. A .22 Caliber rifle was also located inside of the house along with over 400 |
| rounds of ammunition. Additionally TFO Howard is drafting a search warrant for |
| Cadillac SUV, as it is registered to him and he was attempting to enter it as he was taken into custody by |
| DBSPD on August 16th, 2019. |
