On 10/19/2020 at approximately 2030 hours, Deputy C. Sturrup responded to , New
Smyrna Beach in reference to a suicidal subject. Per (R1), she and her boy friend -
(V1) were engaged in a verbal altercation. During the verbal altercation,
(V1) made statements such as "I can not go on like this. I don't matter".
said she heard three gunshots after she left the residence and was afraid (V1) hurt
himself with the firearm.
Upon arrival, Deputy C. Sturrup made contact with (R1).
she and (V1) live at the residence together. (R1) said
(V1) suffers from alcoholism and narcotic addictions. She further explained in detail about a recent
burglary which occurred at the residence upsetting (V1).
(V1) made several statements such as "I can not go on like this. I don't matter". She
further stated (V1) did not want to live anymore. (R1) said she left the
residence and as she was driving down the driveway, she heard three gunshots and was afraid
(V1) hurt himself with the firearm. Per (R1),

then began receiving multiple text messages from (V1) expressing being miserable, and
suicidal insinuations.
Volusia Sheriff's Office then made contact with (V1) via phone.

bipolar disorder and has been having a difficult day. (V1) stated he used the
shotgun to fire three rounds into the ground off his porch. (V1) agreed to exit the
residence and met the deputies in the driveway, where he was secured. Deputy C. Sturrup did not observe
any signs of exterior trauma (physical injury) on (V1). (V1) appeared
to be emotional regarding the recent events (residential burglary and verbal altercation).

(V1) refused to be transported to a medical facility for a psychological examination. Due
to statements made by (V1), Deputy C. Sturrup determined there was a likelihood
without care or treatment he could cause serious bodily harm to himself or others, as evidenced by recent
behavior. Due to (V1)'s actions and intoxication level, Deputy C. Sturrup believed
Robert (V1) was unable to determine for himself whether a psychological examination was
necessary. Deputy C. Sturrup took (V1) into protective custody under provisions of a
Florida Baker Act. (V1) was transported to Halifax Medical Center for further
evaluation and treatment.
