breaking multiple items inside her home. While continuing to question she advised she was
unsure of what inside the home actually scratched her arm. stated she was on multiple
medications and believed the medications made her act out of character. denied medical treatment
for her injuries.
provided verbal consent for deputies to go inside her residence. While inside Deputy Rogers
observed multiple items broken and scattered throughout the common living areas. Deputies also observed
a black handgun (Glock) located on the floor near the kitchen area by the front door. Next to the tirearn
was one single unsent 9mm round and multiple pieces of broken items throughout the house. Small
droplets of dried blood were also observed near the aforementioned firearm.

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Inside the vehicle deputies observed the following:

Based on Deputy Rogers' investigation he determined there was a substantial likelihood that without care or treatment, would likely cause serious bodily harm to herself as evident by her recent behavior.
