Deputy Jones observed video footage from in which is standing behind the vehicle and the vehicle continues to back up despite her being behind it. The vehicle proceeds forward again but then reverses and continues in reverse constantly causing back-up. In the video footage it appears the vehicle bumps into several times before fleeing the scene.
Deputy Gibbons made contact with a witness, (W1), who advised the following:
was walking down when he observed a disturbance in the front yard of observed a female, telling her son, not to steal her car.  observed enter the vehicle and began attempting to leave where another female, stood behind the car attempting to prevent it from leaving. observed the vehicle strike and push her back however, it did not appear suffered any injury. also overheard state to that he wanted to kill himself and threatened to wreck her car in a ditch. David completed a written sworn statement.
While on-scene, Deputy Jones overheard talking to through her cell-phone and stating he left her car at the Pep-Boys, 2835 S Woodland Blvd, and that he was now in his own vehicle. would not tell his location but continued talking to her throughout the call. A BOLO was issued for seven to be vehicle, a silver seven to be vehicle still had the previously assigned Florida temp tag see OCPD case number 22-3128. A felony stop was conducted on seven the vehicle at which time he was taken into custody.

Deputies responded to the Pep-Boys where so vehicle was located behind the business. responded and obtained her vehicle. Deputies observed video footage of the Pep-Boys business and then walking out wearing the same clothing he was wearing upon being arrested.
provided deputies the firearm, a 9mm, serial number which was turned into evidence along with all video footage. Deputy Jones observed the firearm to have one round in the chamber along with five additional rounds in an inserted magazine and the safety off. Stated she did not manipulate the firearm prior to providing it to law enforcement.
An attempt to contact was issued to saddress where deputies made contact with her and informed her of the events that transpired. Was unsure of pressing charges initially however at approximately 1626 hours called law enforcement stating she did wish to pursue charges. Stated entered her home through a bedroom window where he broke the locks and stole her keys at sometime during the morning hours. Proceeded to steal s vehicle and drive around before returning it back to standards advised she had not driven the vehicle prior to the storm however, the vehicle had yard debris on it consistent with having been driven recently. Completed a written sworn statement and stated she wished to pursue charges. Was provided a Victim's Rights Pamphlet.
Deputy Jones made contact with and read him his Constitutional Right's from a Department Issued Miranda card to which advised he understood and was willing to speak with Deputy Jones. Advised earlier in the morning he went to shouse however, he found the residence to be locked. Advised he entered the residence through a open window and noticed his grandmother to be sleeping at which time he left. Stated he later arrived home and an argument ensued with his mother, During the argument, stated he did grab spistol and pointed it to his head however at no point did he point the gun at any other person. Stated after pointing the gun at his head, he threw the gun on the bed, ran outside and took so vehicle. Stated did stand behind the vehicle however, at no time did he hit her.
Based upon the evidence provided, and statements made, Deputy Gibbons determined there was probable cause to charge with the following:
