It should be noted, s office desk was observed facing the window and her back was reported to be towards the doorway. stated she

turned around because of the noise, at which point she observed explaining in the office. explained appeared to be bleeding from the face and was observed holding a chrome revolver which was being held at the low ready. advised the revolver was not pointed toward her, however, she was mortified and in fear because was bleeding from the face, in her residence, and holding a firearm.
According to personal spoke as they made eye contact and asked, if I leave now will everything be good? Explained she was extremely frightened and attempted to persuade him to leave. Stated she told personal she wouldn't call the cops, if he left. Then exited the office and began walking toward the front door with the revolver still in hand. Explained she waited in the office for a brief moment hoping to hear her front door alarm go off, as a means of notifying her had left the residence. After a brief second, returned to the office and pointed the chrome revolver at her. Stated she was in fear for her life, at which point she lunged toward and grabbed the barrel of the firearm in an attempt to disarm him.
explained she continued fighting stated through the front foyer and outside of her residence. Deputies cleared the residence while on scene to ensure there were not additional intruders within the residence. While clearing the residence, Deputy DeLuccia observed multiple blood droplets inside the office area where the incident began. A chrome revolver and black cell phone were also observed on the floor in the front foyer along with blood droplets. Blood was also observed in the driveway leading into the garage and on the front pathway from the front door to the driveway.
described as approximately 5'7 -5'10, wearing a red t-shirt, dark colored shorts, and no shoes. Additionally, was said to have long blond or brown hair.
provided deputies with access to her Ring doorbell camera, which corroborated her account of the incident. In the video surveillance is observed wearing a red t-shirt, dark-colored shorts, and no shoes, and is seen walking up the driveway of
advised she wished to pursue charges and was sworn to her verbal statement while on scene.
Volusia Fire Rescue responded and tended to
Deputies flooded the area in an attempt to locate the suspect. Additionally, Air One was notified and responded to assist.
Sergeant Carelli arrived on scene, and was briefed on the incident, at which point he notified CID Sergeant Weaver and District 4 chain of command who all responded.
Deputies canvassed and obtained further video surveillance of the surrounding residences.
During the canvassing, deputies located a Gray Ford F150 bearing FL Tag VL2AP in the driveway of approximately two blocks west from the incident location It should be noted, the Gray F150 matched the description of the vehicle was said to have gotten into when he left the scene. A query of law enforcement databases revealed the son of the

As deputies were walking up to the residence to make contact with the registered owner at
blood droplets were observed on the driveway near the vehicle. Because the vehicle was consistent with the suspect vehicle had reportedly left in, coupled with the fresh blood droplets which were observed in the driveway, and matching the description of the unknown white male, deputies created a perimeter around the residence and gave verbal commands for the occupants of the residence to exit. Subsequently exited the residence, and was detained pending further investigation. It should be noted, had visible, fresh blood
coming from his facial region, as if he had been in a physical altercation. Additionally, was observed to have fresh blood on his hands and in his fingernails.
