AFFIDAVIT CONTINUATION

FROM SECTION 1
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In addition to the arguing, sometime between the hours of 15:30 - 1800, the disturbance between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] became physical when [REDACTED] choked her against her will, causing her to lose consciousness. [REDACTED] elaborated this had occurred at [REDACTED]'s residence of [REDACTED] in the city limits of Orange City. Once [REDACTED] vacated [REDACTED]'s residence, she returned home. After being home for approximately an hour, [REDACTED] started receiving multiple calls and text messages from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] indicated he needed a screw driver to assist in fixing his motorcycle that had become disabled from faulty equipment. [REDACTED] obtained the requested screw drivers and walked from her residence to [REDACTED] and met with [REDACTED]. Once [REDACTED] reached [REDACTED] he attempted to repair the motorcycle while arguing with [REDACTED] over her having male friends. [REDACTED] was unable to fix his motorcycle, became frustrated, and pushed it onto the ground. At that point, [REDACTED] removed a concealed handgun from his waist band and fired two shots at the taillights of the motorcycle. [REDACTED] described the hand gun as a "ghost gun" and was unsure of the color or caliber. [REDACTED] then picked up the shell casings and debris while making statements that he was going to kill himself and did not want to leave evidence behind. Shortly after this incident, law enforcement was contacted in regards to hearing a gunshot (See CAD #P230402331) in the area and made contact with both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated she was too nervous to advise law enforcement about [REDACTED] shooting at the motorcycle and being choked earlier in the evening as she was worried [REDACTED] would become increasingly more upset. Deputies at that time observed [REDACTED] to be in possession of a concealed firearm and confirmed he had an active concealed weapons permit. [REDACTED] then left the area on his motorcycle, and [REDACTED] began to walk back to the residence. As she reached the residence, she received a phone call from [REDACTED] accusing her of seeing other men and not caring about him. He additionally stated that she was going to be kidnapped by someone in a red vehicle. Once home [REDACTED] shared this information with her family. At that point, her younger sister informed the family she had recently noticed a red vehicle being suspicious in their neighborhood. When asked for additional details of the red vehicle seen in the area, her sister was unable to articulate what day or time the vehicle was seen or its make, model, or any other additional detail. She waited until [REDACTED] vacated the area to re-contact law enforcement to advise what had actually occurred. [REDACTED] provided Deputy Campbell a sworn statement regarding these facts. Deputy Campbell did not find probable cause that a crime associated with dating violence had occurred within the city limits of Deltona.
