PAGE 1 OF 6 On December 27, 2024, at approximately 2208 hours, Deputy Darcy responded to Deland, in reference to an aggravated assault. Upon arrival, contact was made with the reporting party, (V1), who advised the following:
Just prior to contacting law enforcement, was on her way home from work traveling eastbound on approaching advised she was driving her blue (bearing Florida tag and was going approximately 20 - 25 MPH.
stated she saw two subjects on the side of the road walking their dogs, so she made sure to give them ample room when she passed by driving into the opposing lane. As drove by, the male began screaming. Stopped her car and screamed back to figure out what was wrong, which is when the male pulled a black firearm from his pocket, pointed it at face, and screamed "my family", seeming to imply almost hit his family. The roadway in this area is approximately 20 feet wide. It and the unknown male were about even with other in relation to the roadway edges. Streetlights in the area are sparse and there did not appear to be any in the area of the incident that could' ve contributed to the scene.
drove off and was in fear for her safety, thinking the male was going to shoot her.
returned home and got into her other vehicle in an attempt to locate where the subjects were walking to but was met with negative results. The swapped vehicle was in an attempt to conceal her identity so as to avoid further conflict with the male. described the male as white, approximately 5'10" in height, and weighing about 160 pounds. The male was wearing jeans and a camouflage pattern t-shirt. The female he was with was described as white, heavy-set, approximately 5'06" in height, and weighing about 250 pounds.

completed a sworn written statement and was adamant she would like to pursue charges.

On December 31, Detective Forster was assigned this case for a follow up investigation.				
Detective Forster made contact with who advised she had no new information to share at this time. Detective Forster reinterviewed who explained a similar statement to the original provided to Deputy Darcy. confirmed the suspect appeared to be a white male approximately 5′ 10″ in height and weighing about 160 pounds. added the male appeared skinny and had a goatee on his face.				
be an all-black Glock semi-automatic pistol, due to her owning a similar firearm. s firearm ownership lends credibility to her belief and understanding of the imminent danger of having a firearm pointed at her.				
On the female, elaborated that she was not involved other than walking one of the two dogs with the suspect.				
confirmed she still wished to pursue criminal charges.				
Detective Forster completed a neighborhood canvas of the area which resulted in the following:				

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Detective Forster observed the video surveillance from which captured the incident. The camera angle provided was on the north side of the residence which captured Evergreen Rd and its connection with 5th Avenue. The start of the argument occurs off the camera, however the audio is captured.
Detective Forster observed s brake lights on her vehicles light up as the unknown male suspect yells. An argument ensued in which a male voice yells at "you almost hit me and my family" s response is illegible and both parties separate. Based on the location, time of day, and no one else present on the video surveillance, it corroborates the voices heard are and the unknown male.
Detective Forster observed an unknown male and unknown female walk westbound on Evergreen Rd away from the incident. The female is heard stating to the male suspect, " come on, why you point a gun at somebody". She continued, " are you serious" and " what are you thinking". Detective Forster observed the couple turn and walk south bound on 5th Avenue,
Detective Forster observed video surveillance from which captured the unknown male and female walk past the residence prior to the aggravated assault. Detective Forster observed them walking two smaller dogs, which advised in her original statement. Based on the neighborhood canvas, it appeared the couple traveled in a square around their neighboring streets.
Detective Forster continued his canvas to surveillance. At this time, Detective Forster made contact with a resident of the aforementioned address. The physique matched the description provided by
appeared concerned and seemingly froze at the sight of Detective Forster. began to answer Detective Forster's questions slowly, with a stiff posture, and an unemotional affect. was curious as to why Detective Forster was completing a canvas, Detective Forster advised it was due to a person pointing a gun at someone, in which rever responded. explained there was no video surveillance at their residence.

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Detective Forster was contacted by the residence of who advised his wife looked at the video surveillance and recognized the unknown male and female. Detective Forster spoke with who stated she recognized the subjects in the video surveillance. explained the couple matched the description of the married couple at completed a sworn written statement.
Detective Forster accessed investigative databases and observed, wife, to live at the residence. is approximately 5′ 06″ in height and a heavier set blonde female. This physique was similar to the female captured in the video surveillance. It should be noted, while at inside.
Detective Forster completed an FCIC/NCIC criminal history check on three misdemeanor charges, all which were filed or dropped.
On January 3, 2025, Detective Forster generated a photo lineup and made contact with Detective Forster contacted and asked if she would be willing to participate in a photo lineup, agreed. However, advised she is unsure how beneficial it would be due to her primarily being focused on the firearm, rather than the subjects' features.
Deputy Edwards assisted by meeting with to conduct the photo lineup. Deputy Edwards read the photo lineup instructions and presented the simultaneous lineup. Deputy Edwards the photo lineup and advised she was not confident enough to select one of the photographs. Detective Forster later obtained and submitted the lineup into the District Two evidence locker.
Detective Forster determined, due to the couple to having leashed dogs, the time of night, and the woman appearing heavier set, the couple lived local in the neighborhood. This corroborates how drove past the subjects on her way home from work.

Through Detective Forster's investigation, coupled with physical evidence and statements, Detective Forster determined probable cause exist to charge with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.
Detectives made contact with placed under arrest. Detectives were granted consent to search his work vehicle bearing Florida tag via the registered owner. Detectives were unable to locate any firearm inside the vehicle. Detectives completed a search incident to arrest of sperson which yielded negative results for a firearm.
