On 3/10/24 at approximately 1819 hours, Deputy Seda responded to City in reference to a suicidal person.
A caller advised Central Dispatch her elderly neighbor, later identified as (O1), was outside his residence with a firearm pointed at his head. The caller stated possibly intoxicated and suffered from Alzheimer.
It should be noted deputies have had prior involvements with various firearms in his residence.
Upon arrival deputies observed was playing loud music from his vehicle which had its driver's side door op was observed on multiple occasions taking a drink from what appeared to be a bottle alcohol while holding the handgun to his head. Deputies secured a perimeter around residence and surrounding streets. Sergeant Stickels and Deputy Berard attempted establish a dialogue with but he continued to stand in his driveway talking to himself. Eventually began to speak with deputies who were stationed across the street South of the reside behind hard cover. Sould be heard saying he wanted to die and did not want to die. Advised deputies he did not want to get shot and was not going to hurt law enforcement was instructed numerous times to drop the firearm and he failed to do so. During the course of speaking with seventually stopped while standing on again instructed to drop the firearm. Ultimately began approaching deputies again and was struck with 4 less lethal shotgun rounds. The less lethal rounds caused to drop the firearm and deputies quickly secured him. Was struck in the right forearm, left tricep, mid right back, and the waistband of his right back. While secured advised he was side of being alone and wanted law enforcement to shoot him.
Based on Deputy Seda's investigation, it was determined there was a substantial likelihood the without care or treatment, would harm himself or others as evident by his recent behavior. was taken into protective custody under the Baker Act.

It is stated he occasionally plays "Russian roulette" in his garage and he was tired of playing. It is became very thankful towards law enforcement and medical staff. It is began stating he did not know why deputies arrived at his residence and began to point firearms at him. It is to was checked further for injuries but none were located.
Photographs were taken of shandgun and injuries, which were later uploaded to Evidence.com. It is black Ruger 9mm handgun was collected and the serial number was ran through FCIC/NCIC which returned as negative. The spent less lethal rounds and shells were also collected. They were all submitted into the District 6 evidence locker.
It should be noted, s handgun was loaded and had a round in the chamber.
While securing the residence, deputies observed several AR style rifles in plain view inside the residence. Due to threatening his life with a firearm, a Risk Protection Order was completed.
