MARSY'S LAW INVOKED

On 11/27/2025 at approximately 1233 hours, Deputy Santiago responded to 3192 Post Street, Deltona in reference to a road rage incident where one party pulled a firearm on another. Upon arrival, Deputy Santiago made contact with [REDACTED] (V1), who advised the following:

[REDACTED] was on her way to her parents' house, who live at [REDACTED], Deltona, for Thanksgiving dinner. [REDACTED] was driving her gray Toyota Rav 4 bearing Florida tag [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was driving on Howland Boulevard passing graves avenue when she observed a black Dodge Charger bearing Florida tag [REDACTED] driving under the speed limit in the left-hand lane. [REDACTED] attempted to pass the charger on the right lane near the Mister Car Wash at 3119 Howland Boulevard, to which the black Dodge Charger began to accelerate to prevent [REDACTED] from passing. [REDACTED] was able to pass the Dodge Charger on the right and turned back into the left lane in front of Dodge Charger and passed two more cars that were in the right lane. The black Dodge Charger began driving extremely close to [REDACTED]'s vehicle, almost hitting the rear of her vehicle. [REDACTED] switched lanes to the right and took her foot of the gas to allow the charger to pass her. While approaching the intersection of Howland Boulevard and Dr. Martin Luther King Boulevard, she observed the driver of the black Dodge Charger roll down the passenger side window of the vehicle. [REDACTED] described the driver to be a black male with dreads. [REDACTED] advised she did not see anybody else inside the vehicle. [REDACTED] advised the male pointed a black handgun at her. [REDACTED] described the handgun to be a black and silver pistol with a silver outline down the barrel of the firearm. [REDACTED] advised she immediately became in fear for her life and slammed on the brakes to get behind the vehicle. [REDACTED] remained behind the vehicle and was able to obtain the Florida tag to provide to deputies. [REDACTED] stated she observed the vehicle turn left from Howland Boulevard onto a side street which led into a neighborhood but did not catch the name of the street. [REDACTED] advised the street was past the post office located at 2048 Howland Boulevard, Deltona. [REDACTED] advised she had a clear view of the male's face and would be able to identify the male in a show up. [REDACTED] completed a sworn written statement of the incident indicating she wished to pursue criminal charges, along with Marsy's Law indicating she wished to keep her information private.

Deputy Santiago conducted an NCIC/FCIC inquiry of the tag [REDACTED] provided ([REDACTED]), which came back to a black Dodge Charger as [REDACTED] described. The vehicle had two registered

registered owners, [REDACTED] (D1) and [REDACTED] (O1). Deputy Santiago observed a photo of [REDACTED], the only male registered owner, via the Driver and Vehicle Information Database (D.A.V.I.D.) and observed him to be a black male with dreads, matching the same description provided by [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had a registered address of [REDACTED], Deltona. It is to be noted to get into the neighborhood, the vehicle would have had to take a left on Howland Boulevard from the direction of the incident. Deputy Santiago conducted a Flock inquiry of the vehicle, which showed the vehicle scan at [REDACTED] at 11:54 hours and then again at [REDACTED] at 1202 hours, placing the vehicle in the same area and at the same time as when the incident occurred. Deputy Santiago conducted a Flock inquiry of [REDACTED]'s vehicle bearing Florida tag [REDACTED], which showed her vehicle scan at [REDACTED] at 1154 hours and then again at [REDACTED] at 1202 hours. It is to be noted on the photo of [REDACTED]'s vehicle hitting the Flock camera, [REDACTED]'s Dodge Charger bearing Florida tag [REDACTED] is seen in front of her vehicle in the left lane. Deputy Santiago uploaded a photo of the flock hit into Axon Evidence as evidence.

Deputies responded to the address of [REDACTED], Deltona where they observed the black Dodge Charger and [REDACTED] standing outside the residence. Deputies were able to make contact with [REDACTED] and detain him. Deputy Carroll read [REDACTED] his Miranda Rights from an agency issued Miranda warnings card, to which he advised he understood and wished to speak to deputies. [REDACTED] admitted to being the driver of the Dodge Charger and just arriving to the address of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] claimed he was driving with his wife [REDACTED] and his son [REDACTED] (O2). [REDACTED] denied having a firearm or pointing it at anyone during any point in time.

Deputies attempted to make contact with [REDACTED], who refused to give any statements or provide any information to deputies.

Deputy Santiago placed [REDACTED] into the back of his patrol vehicle in order to conduct a show-up. Deputy Santiago explained to [REDACTED] the person of interest may or may not be the person in the identification procedure and she should not feel compelled to make an identification. [REDACTED] advised she understood the directions. Deputy Santiago relocated to [REDACTED], Deltona with [REDACTED] where she immediately was able to 100 percent identify [REDACTED] as the male who was driving the vehicle and pointed a firearm at her.

Deputy Santiago completed a witness show up form and later submitted it into the district 4 records box.

Based on Deputy Santiago investigation, coupled with statements from all parties and evidence from Flock cameras and the positive identification from [REDACTED], Deputy Santiago determined probable cause to charge [REDACTED] with FSS 784.021 aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

Deputy Santiago conducted a criminal history on [REDACTED] which revealed no criminal history.

Due to the incident involving a firearm, Deputy Santiago completed a Temporary Risk Protection Order on [REDACTED]

Due to [REDACTED] indicating his child was inside the vehicle, Director Carla Quann was notified of the incident.

[REDACTED] was transported to the Volusia County Branch Jail.

Case Status: Arrest/Adult.
