On July 16, 2026, Deputy Nelson was dispatched to the above address in reference to a female subject later identified as [REDACTED] screaming for 911.

Prior to arrival Central Dispatch advised a county employee was mowing grass in the area of 41 Enterprise St, when he heard a female voice screaming for 911 and help. According to Central Dispatch the employee never saw anyone and could not located the person screaming.

Deputy Nelson arrived on scene and made contact with [REDACTED] who provided an approximate direction of the screaming person, which was in the direction of a residence known to Deputy Nelson where prior domestic issues have occurred. Deputy Nelson responded to [REDACTED] and made contact with [REDACTED] in the driveway of the residence.

According to [REDACTED] is pregnant and has been manic for the last few days and breaking things in the house. [REDACTED] stated while he was in the shower, [REDACTED] was yelling and threatening him with a firearm. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] previously punched him in the face, and he pushed her away. At some point [REDACTED] grabbed her gun and was walking round the house threatening him. Additionally, [REDACTED] stated he knew [REDACTED] would have "marks" on her from him trying to restrain her. Deputy Nelson instructed [REDACTED] to wait in his friend's truck so Deputies could make contact with [REDACTED] and secure the firearm she was walking around with.

[REDACTED] allowed Deputies to view a video on his phone in which [REDACTED] is seen standing in the bedroom yelling at [REDACTED] while he is in the shower. At some point [REDACTED] reaches under a blanket or pillow and grabs a black object [REDACTED] stated was a gun. Deputies could see a small black object in [REDACTED] hand as she states, "I'm not afraid of you". Deputy Nelson observed an abrasion on the right side of [REDACTED] face, which he stated was from [REDACTED] punching him. Additionally, [REDACTED] showed Deputy Nelson other injuries on his back which he states are also from [REDACTED] on different occasions.

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Deputies made contact with [REDACTED] on scene at the porch as she stepped out and screamed "fuck you", from the doorway of the house. Deputies observed [REDACTED] to be hysterical and crying and she immediately began explaining the incident. According to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] has been keeping her in the house and beating her for no reason. [REDACTED] stated earlier in the day [REDACTED] and her were fighting or arguing and she walked out of the house to get away. While outside, [REDACTED] chased her down and shoved her to the ground and put dog feces in her face. [REDACTED] states since last night [REDACTED] has been physically abusing her and hitting her for no reason. [REDACTED] later stated she believes [REDACTED] has been violent with her due to her recently becoming pregnant and [REDACTED] not wanting to have kids.

[REDACTED] allowed Deputies to observe a video on her phone of [REDACTED] chasing her down and yelling at her about recording him. At the end of the video [REDACTED] is seen aggressively approaching [REDACTED] and grabbing her arms as the phone and [REDACTED] fall to the ground as they were outside of the residence on concrete. [REDACTED] states this is how she received the injury to her knee which was actively bleeding. Additionally, Deputy Nelson observed a substantial number of bruises on [REDACTED] legs and facial area consistent with her statement of being hit by [REDACTED]

Deputy Nelson asked [REDACTED] if she in fact had a firearm in her possession. [REDACTED] produced a small black handgun bearing serial number (3809527576), from within her purse. The handgun was holstered and concealed within her purse. Deputy Nelson secured the firearm and rendered it safe.

A criminal history check was completed on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] via TTY. [REDACTED] is not a convicted felon and at the time of this report had no prior charges for battery. [REDACTED] has a current Temporary Protection Order signed by the State Attorney stating she is to have no violent contact with [REDACTED] in relation a prior domestic violence arrest. According to court files in that case on July 8, 2026, [REDACTED] signed a declination to pursue charges, which is also filed with the State Attorney.

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Deputy Carrol conducted a lethality assessment with [REDACTED] and ultimately determined [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were in a lethal situation based on the scores.

Deputy Nelson conducted a lethality assessment with [REDACTED] and also determined [REDACTED] was in a lethal situation based on the scores.

A TRPO/RPO was completed for [REDACTED] based on the circumstances of the incident and forwarded for review.

Based on the totality of the circumstances, coupled with evidence and statements collected on scene it was determined probable cause existed to charge [REDACTED] with aggravated battery on a person he knew to be pregnant at the time he battered her. Additionally, probable cause was determined to arrest [REDACTED] [REDACTED] for aggravated assault. [REDACTED] was placed in custody and later transported to VCBJ without incident. [REDACTED] was transported to Fish Memorial hospital due to her pregnancy and injuries she sustained during the altercation with [REDACTED] and later to VCBJ.
